### **Explanation of the sessions**

#### **Presentation of the participants**

Brief (2 minutes each) round table to introduce all of the participants

#### **Presentation and data sessions:**

<u>Concept</u>: 4 parallel sessions with a PhD student presenting their work/data. For the first 30 minutes, the PhD student presents his/her work and discusses it with the group. Then, the groups change: the *presenter* and a pre-designated *witness* remain in the group, while the other participants change groups. For the next 30 minutes, the *witness* first briefly summarises the data/research of the PhD student and the state of the discussion, and then the group discusses the research. Then, groups change again with the same system for one last session.

<u>Time</u>: 15 minutes to introduce the concept, then 3x30min sessions <u>Rationale</u>: encouraging discussion and reformulation of other's projects, proving new perspectives' on one's work. It also makes it easier to have small group discussions with a large number of participants, without having to present one's work three times. The groups are decided in advance according to facilitate the process (and depending on the participants' research themes and interests). <u>Roles</u>: the *presenters* are the PhD students who asked to present for this event. The *witnesses* were chosen among the other PhDs depending on their research interests. None of them know the project they will have to summarise beforehand, the aim being to foster new insight. However, if you have been attributed a *witness* role and do not want to do it, let us know and we will ask someone else.

#### Panels

Two panels sessions of 45 minutes each. The questions to be discussed will be taken from the discussion of the previous day and prepared by a group of PhD students. #### Discussion groups on relevant issues

Based on the questions raised in the panels and the day before, the room will be split in four tables, each addressing a specific issue. For each table a 'rapporteur' is designated, who will be in charge of summarising the discussion for the last session. Participants choose a table where they discuss the theme of the table, changing table ever 20 minutes, except for the rapporteur.

#### Discussion groups: doing a PhD

Four discussion groups for PhD students depending on the stage of their research: pre data collection or early data collection (1 group), finishing data collection and analysis (2 groups), finishing the analysis and writing up (1 group). In case of disagreement with the group in which you have been put, please let us know in advance so we can correct it.

<u>Time</u>: 45 minutes of discussion among the PhD students, discussing their issues with the PhD, then 45 minutes of discussion with the professors, who join the group of their choosing (1 to 2 professor per group), and discuss the issues raised in the first 45 minutes.
