→ This article examines critically how digital technologies are being introduced into agriculture through the interacting forms of expertise and coalitions of authority in relation to both private and public players in smart farming initiatives. The authors add to current debates about the origins of and driving forces behind emerging technologies for agriculture through the investigation of two case studies, relating to a Swiss drone startup that obtained the first authorisation for crop spraying with their home-made drone, and to a private–public smart farming test compound. The article argues that a way of understanding how digital technologies find their way into the farming sector is to consider not only the complex set of relationships between public and private actors but also the influence of space and materiality on the socio-technical composition of the technologies. The article adopts a politico-geographical angle of analysis by grounding its theoretical posture in Foucauldian understandings of power, relational conceptions of space and the agency of materiality, which is anchored in actor-network theory. Within this theoretical stream, the authors introduce the concepts of ‘interacting expertise’ and ‘coalitions of authority’ as a conceptual toolkit for comprehending how an interplay between private companies, public institutions and a range of spatial–material arrangements contributes to what is widely understood in Switzerland as smart farming.

→ The paper investigates how spray drones transform the ways in which the aerial realm is lived and perceived in the farming sector. It does so through the in-depth empirical study of the air-bound practices, expectations and imaginations that arise from the development and commercialization of the first authorized drone system in Europe for the automated application of pesticides, sold and piloted by a Swiss start-up company. Spray drones, such is the paper’s basic argument, make the air relevant in novel, inherently functionalised and commercialised ways for agricultural practices and processes. Thus the aerial realm is being re-discovered as an object of pragmatically motivated alliances but also of competitions arising from the involved stakeholders’ agendas and organizational structures. This leads to a critical discussion of the issues surrounding the increasing instrumentalization of the air for agro-entrepreneurialist purposes.

→ This article reconsiders sport mega-event security in the context of the 2014 FIFA World Cup and the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio de Janeiro. The article essentially argues that the mega-event organizers used a security spectacle to camouflage Rio's politics of death in the many favelas and peripheral neighborhoods. Conceptually, this contribution centralizes different notions of spectacle and camouflage and situates both in the history of violent and racial policing of the poor in Brazil. Empirically, the piece explores, across three sections, how (1) the city was transformed into a spectacular fortress by adapting standardized mega-event security measures to the specific public security conditions in Rio; (2) the Olympic fortress was nonetheless selectively porous and permeable; and (3) the spectacle served to camouflage the otherwise deadly police deployments of socio-spatial patterns along lines of class and racial inequalities.

→ This article draws upon a large-scale survey on professional (public institution and private company) drone usage in Switzerland. The authors argue that professional drone usage implies a wide range of applications and objectives and, thus, logics of vision and visibility. Rather than systematic and predictable, the visibilities created by professional drone usage are punctual in occurrence, highly varying in spatial logics and articulations and, therefore, often unpredictable. This raises important questions and problems with regard to the power dynamics unfolding from the visual and visualising capabilities of the technology that reach far beyond the usual focus on surveillance in current academic engagements with the topic.

→ This article investigates how new digital technologies are established in agriculture. It does so by drawing upon empirical data from a qualitative case study with a Swiss based but internationally operating start-up that has recently obtained the first authorisation to spray crop protection products on vineyards and fruit plantations with their home-made drone. Conceptually the article takes inspiration in Actor-Network-Theory (ANT) and challenges common understandings of overly urban centred approaches of how new technologies find entry in public policies.

→ In this article, I explore police officers as 'edgeworkers' and how their emotional and spatial edging contributes crucially to the production of 'police territoriality,' the attempt to establish urban order and the making of everyday tensions in Rio de Janeiro. I propose two main conceptual contributions both to geography and criminology. The first concerns a comprehension of police territoriality that considers the often-ignored emotional worlds of police officers that, so I argue, are crucially important to understand how the production of space and policing are interrelated. The second regards the concept of edgework that most often lacks an important spatial component. Only by taking both together can we better appreciate the ways in which the police shapes and is shaped by space. The piece provides unique insights from ethnographic fieldwork with police forces in Rio.

→ This article reconsiders contemporary urban security governance in the context of post-colonial settings. Conceptually, the paper revisits Foucault's governmentality lectures to comprehend how security governance is carried out in places where the use of digital security technologies co-exists with overly lethal and repressive forms of policing. The author argues that the production of in/security in these violent contexts has to be understood as a *triangle of security governance* in which disciplinary powers of control, apparatuses of security and sovereign/necropower are at work simultaneously, complemented by a fourth dimension that takes into account the socio-technical relationship between the agency of humans and machines with what Foucault outlined in the lectures as the 'government of things'. Empirically, the article explores the technopolitical turn in urban security policies in the city of Rio de Janeiro in the wake of the 2014 World Cup and the 2016 Olympics. Imbedded in globalised mega-event security standards and legacy discourses, authorities in Rio promoted a narrative of new *material* and *nonmaterial* security measures that were intended to both secure the Games and to help overcome permanently entrenched urban conflicts in the city. By critically analysing these two approaches, the author shows how new security technologies are perfectly integrated into a continuum of deadly in/security politics in Rio de Janeiro and that is conceptually best appreciated by considering how the triangle of security governance works in the digital era.

→ This paper argues that at its very core, the policy response to a pandemic such as COVID-19 is shaped by the search for the right balance between openness and closure, mobility and public safety. More specifically, drawing upon relevant social-scientific literatures and examples relating to the fight against COVID-19 in Switzerland, the paper highlights three broad and fundamentally intertwined spatial logics of control and restriction through which differing degrees and modalities of closure and openness are being articulated in the context of infectious disease. These refer to (1) border and access control; (2) the monitoring of people and objects on the move; and (3) to the internal organization and monitoring of specific spatial enclaves. The three spatial logics of control offer an exploratory framework, the paper argues, to study the functioning and implications outbreak response both during and after the pandemic.

→ The planned theme section revolves around two main topics, connected with the current efforts of software-driven data collection, transfer and analysis in agriculture: On the one hand, the theme section focusses on the power issues and micro-politics involved in the making and diffusion of new smart-farming solutions. Based on the study of particular projects and sites, this will allow the critical investigation of the organisational settings and situated coalitions of authority underpinning current efforts towards the software-mediated governing of agriculture. On the other hand, the theme section explores the 'acting' of smart-farming solutions. This second aspect starts from the aforementioned understanding that computer algorithms involved in smart farming are both produced by and in turn produce specific orderings of reality. This

problematic implies a focus on the rationalities of power inherent in the software-mediated techniques of control and regulation that today proliferate in the farming sector, leading also to the critical question of how contemporary smart farming solutions change the ways in which farming is being lived, perceived, and conceived.

It provides an ethnographic case study of Rio de Janeiro’s civil police and within the city’s sport mega-event surveillance and security architecture. The book critically explores and problematises the adaptation and impact of standardised and globalised sport mega-event security models on local public security conditions in the city of Rio de Janeiro before, during and after the 2014 World Cup and the 2016 Olympics. The book contrasts cutting-edge technology-based systems of surveillance, communication and security purchased and implemented for the events with traditional police work culturally embedded in traditions of violence and social inequality.
