## Full professor or assistant professor (tenure track) in mathematics (100%), orientation algebra

**Job description:** The successful candidate will teach various courses in the Bachelors and Masters in Mathematics, as well as in other courses of study. The teaching load is 7 hours/week all year long (4 hours/week for an assistant professor) The candidate is expected to establish an internationally recognized research program in algebra, with a preference for the domains of commutative algebra and algebraic geometry. He/she will supervise master's and doctoral theses and participate in the administrative tasks of the institute and the Faculty. Courses are taught in French or English, requiring a commitment to obtain sufficient fluency in French within one year.

**Requirements:** Applicants must hold a doctorate in mathematics, have an internationally recognized research record in algebra and demonstrate strong teaching skills.

**Starting date:** February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024 or upon agreement.

**Deadline for applications:** December 31, 2022.

FS-ALG) including a letter of motivation, a CV documenting full teaching and research experience, a list of publications, copies of diplomas and a list of experts able to assess the candidate's competence (at least three names). The candidate is also invited to include a statement (5 pages max.) of teaching and research interests, his/her scientific approach to the domain, and projects that he/she intends to undertake at Neuchâtel.
