- Interest to work on the evaluation and prediction of mutual and hedge funds' trading strategies.
- Strong quantitative skills. Interest in machine learning / textual analysis / big data is a plus.
- Profound programming skills in a statistical software package (such as R, Stata, SAS, Matlab, or Python).
- Excellent command of the English language. French language skills are a plus.

- Contract term of 4 years with annual renewal.
