- Participate in the development of the ITTS.

The successful candidate is expected to pursue a PhD in social work within the [ITTS PhD program](#), either as an existing ITTS PhD student or as a new doctoral candidate who will enroll in the program and secure appropriate supervision.

- You hold a master's degree in social work, sociology, anthropology, political science or a related field.
- You have excellent knowledge in (some of) qualitative research methods.
- You have strong social and communication skills.
- You are able to work in an English-speaking environment (see ITTS PhD program) and will be able to write your thesis in either English, French, German or Italian.
