## Full professor or assistant professor with tenure track in occupational health psychology

**Job description:** The successful candidate is expected to conduct cutting-edge research in occupational health psychology, demonstrated by publications in top-tier international journals and a strong record of securing competitive third-party funding. Excellence in teaching is also expected, as evidenced by the use of innovative instructional methods. Teaching responsibilities include courses in the Master's program in Work and Organizational Psychology (<https://www.unine.ch/ipto/formation/master-of-science-en-psychologie>) and potentially contributions to a future Bachelor's program in psychology.

**Requirements:** Applicants must hold a doctorate in Psychology or a closely related field and possess an internationally recognized research track record as well as extensive teaching experience. Courses will be taught in French (possibly in English at the Master's level). A grace period of two years may be granted to non-French speakers before teaching in French is required.

**Starting date:** August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026, or upon agreement.

This information will be used to calculate your net academic age to ensure a fair and equitable evaluation process.
